

A little bit of information about the cheeses that feature in this song

Brie - a soft cow's-milk cheese named after Brie the French region from which it originated.

Camembert - a soft, creamy, cow's milk cheese that was originally made in Camembert, northwest France.

Cottage cheese - is curdled milk with a mild flavour and a creamy texture, made from skimmed milk and cream.

Dobrodar - is a cheese from Ukraine. It is usually covered in a special wax.

Feta - is a Greek white cheese that is soaked in brine and is made from sheep milk or from a mixture of sheep and goat milk.

Gorgonzola - is a famously pungent Italian blue cheese made from cow's milk.

Kalimpong - is made in and named after Kalimpong, a hill station in the Indian state of West Bengal.

Mozarella - is a semi-soft cheese which has its origins in southern Italy.

Munster - is a French soft cheese with a strong taste and is made mainly from milk. The name "Munster" is from a town in France.

Ricotta - is an Italian cheese made from sheep, cow, goat, or Italian water buffalo milk whey.

Stilton - is an English cheese, produced in two varieties: blue, and white.

Stinking Bishop - is a soft cheese from Gloucestershire in England. It is famous for being quite whiffy.

Wagasi - is a type of West African cheese made from cow's milk.

This Nativity tells the story based only on what can be found in the Bible.

Nothing is added and nothing is taken away.

It is aimed at older children (10-13 years old) or church/youth groups.
